

A Reading from 1 Corinthians 11

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

What is Adoration?

Adoration is an ancient tradition of the Church. As Catholics we believe that at the consecration during the Mass, the bread and wine cease to exist and in their place are the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus. This is the Eucharist. Outside of Mass, we can visit Jesus (who is present in the Eucharist). When we pray to Jesus who is before us as the Eucharist, we are adoring him. This is what adoration is.

Act of Adoration

I adore You, O Jesus, true God and true Man, here present in the Holy Eucharist, humbly present before You and united in spirit with all the believers on earth and all the blessed who have gone to be with You. In deep gratitude for so marvellous a blessing, I love You, my Jesus, with my whole heart, for You are all perfect and all worthy of love. Give me help nevermore in any way to offend You, and grant that I, being refreshed by Your Eucharistic presence here on earth, may be found worthy to come to the enjoyment with Mary of Your eternal and ever blessed presence in heaven. Amen.
